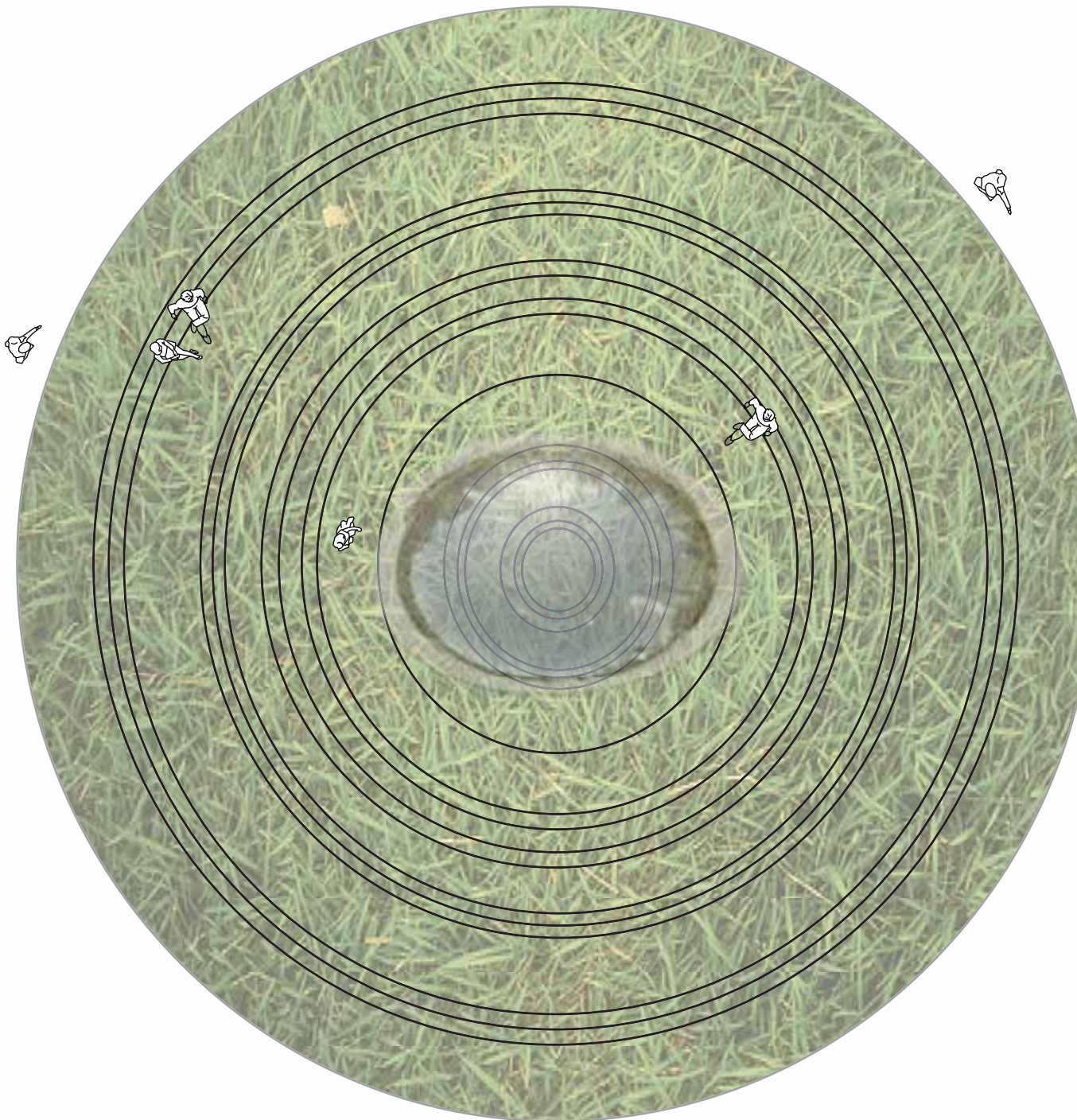
provide **gathering places** in which people “**gather together**”
